

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I have been told that I am a naïve person, and I wear it like a badge of honor. Whereas some people are drawn into commiserating about the state of the world, I am filled with joy about the stories and people who make a difference in everyday lives. I believe that our future is in good hands, because the youth of today are much more adept at responding to outside influences than we were a generation or two ago. Kids in our schools today must have a plan for if an active shooter enters the building, the reality of cyberbullying, and being compromised on their social media platforms and navigating through busy schedules that include work and extracurricular activities on top of staying up on their studies. When I was a kid the only things I worried about were which football team I'd be on at recess or if there'd be seconds at lunch. I believe that all God's people, no matter where they are from, what their skin color is, and what they identify as in their sexual orientation, are inherently good, and that the great majority of people want nothing more than to live joyful and productive lives and want the very same for their fellow humans.

Maybe I'm a dreamer, but I believe that dreams are seeds of hope, and that is what I am going to cling to. It's worked for me so far.

I also think that there must be a certain naivety when it comes to the Festival of All Saints as well. On this festival, celebrated the first Sunday of November, we remember all who have completed their earthly journey and now reside in the promises of their baptism. At face value it seems rather fanciful to believe that after we take our last breath that we are transformed to another plane where we will live forever. We are asked to believe in that which is framed by our worldly standards as unbelievable. In a world which dwells within finite boundaries, we are given the opportunity to believe that we can transcend those boundaries after we breathe our last. What would drive us to believe that this is possible?

I believe that the answer is not believing in what is unbelievable, but, rather, believing in what we witness. Historical narrative informs us that 2000 years ago Jesus Christ defied the laws of nature by rising from the dead, in essence, bringing the kingdom of Heaven to earth. As people of faith, we cling to this two millennia old event; but if we're willing to open our eyes and witness our contemporary world through this same lens, we still get to see glimpses of heaven all around us.

Whether they know him or not, the love of Christ dwells within all God's people, and it's our choice as to whether we see Christ in them. Our sinful behavior makes it easy to get bogged down in labeling others, judging them by their actions or behaviors which differ from our own, or simply not trusting them based on what we think we know about them. But, when we do this, we are essentially closing that window—that glimpse into heaven. When we cut ourselves off from seeing Christ in the other, we are cutting ourselves off from relationship with Christ. We are choosing to believe in what we want to believe, a belief limited to the constraints of a mortal world, instead of belief

in the immortality that exists beyond what we know or what we think we know even though it is clearly visible to us.

Like I said, I may be naïve. I may be a dreamer. But I can also say with utmost certainty that I know joy in choosing to see Christ alive in the other, and I wouldn't trade that joy for anything. Why would anyone want anything less?



## Grace Historical Dates

- 10-1-1987 to 4-6-1988 Nave, narthex, bell tower, and balcony painted. Bell tower window removed and repaired. New ceiling fans installed.
- 1-31-1988 Goals for 1988: Purchase and implement computer system for church. Feasibility study for blacktopping of the south parking lot.
- 2-9-1988 A light switch was installed in the cemetery shed, instead of turning on lights from the church building.
- 4-19-1988 Prayer and Share began as a midweek mini series.
- 5-10-1988 Garden cart purchased for use by custodian.
- 5-10-1988 Telephone underground cable installed through cemetery. Route was approved by the cemetery board. (The route is unknown.)
- 7-12-1988 South sign unit is repaired by Dave McNamee.
- 7-12-1988 Voted to replace main entry doors (\$1000 from Eggers)
- 8-9-1988 Building of new entrance doors progressing. They will be shipped to glass company on 9-6-1988 and should be ready for installation in early November.
- —Facts are assembled and submitted by David Christianson, with the help of several people who went through historical materials and pulled out data of note.
