

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As we transition from Thanksgiving to the Christmas season, our disposition goes through a natural transition as well. Thanksgiving is all about doing just that – giving thanks for what we have, for the people that we have around us, for what God has so graciously provided for us, for not being Bears fans (though I almost....almost feel bad for them lately). We expound much time in worship and in fellowship giving thanks to our loving God for we, indeed, have much for which to give thanks.

But as we turn the page from Thanksgiving into Advent, our focus shifts to preparing for Christmas, and for a lot of us, that preparation includes sending out wish lists and gifts, Christmas cards, invitations, "Thank You's," and the like. As much as it truly is the season of giving, it is very much also the season of sending.

But what must not ever be forgotten is that the sending includes us. As baptized Christians we have been and are continuing to be sent. Some of the last words that Jesus prayed with his disciples during their last supper together included the invitation of God through the Holy Spirit to go with his followers as they shared the Good News of God's love to all the earth. The Christmas story – the story of God coming into our world as a human child, God's act of salvation for the whole world – is the story that we all can joyfully share as we go about our daily endeavors. Jesus sent his disciples with the story of Hope and we, as his modernday disciples, have been sent with the same message.

With this reminder that we are all called for the purpose of being sent, this will be our focus during this Advent season. The theme of our midweek Advent services (5:30 Wednesday evenings in December) will be "Sent: Delivering the Gift of Hope at Christmas." This series is based upon the book of the same name by the Reverend Jorge Acevedo, a pastor in the Methodist church. Each Wednesday evening, I will share a devotional story and reflection from the book. Also, we will sing to-



Grace Historical Dates

- 8-9-1988 Movie was filmed at Grace this fall. Received \$500. The movie, *Meet the Applegates* was released on February 1, 1991.
- 8-15-24 Music room was constructed, painted, and carpeted. The Blue room was painted and carpeted.
- 10-11-1988 Received additional \$1000 for use of Grace for the film
- 10-11-1988 Installation of shelving in the lounge for new library.
- 11-8-1988 Computer has been purchased and installed. Training should start soon.
- 12-6-1988 New entrance doors have been installed.
- 1989 The contemporary Sunday worship service was begun.
- 4-19-1989 Prayer and Share began as a midweek mini series.
- 5-10-1989 Under supervision of the cemetery board, the fence along the north boundary of the cemetery will be removed. (Note: Fence was removed by Ted Eckstein on 7-11-2011.)
- 6-13-1989 Office work room project begun.
- 11-4-1989 Lounge painted and new furniture purchased.
