From the Desk of Pastor Mark



The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for

the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest." – St. Luke 24:5-9 (NRSV)

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Young Jonathan, who had been promised a new puppy for his tenth birthday, had a tough time choosing one from the dozen likely candidates at the neighborhood pet shop. Finally, he decided on one nondescript shaggy pup who was wagging his tail furiously. Explained Jonathan, "I want the one with the happy ending."

After six weeks of Lenten darkness, in remembering the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter morning, God once again reminds us of our "happy ending." We are reminded once again that while the journey may be filled with moments of doubt and despair, that it's what is at the end that carries all the weight – and for us, just like it was for Jesus' disciples at that first Easter – it's hope fulfilled.

The twelve verses that we will read from St. Luke on Easter morning are filled with language of this despair and doubt: The women were perplexed when they came to the tomb and could not find the body; they were terrified when the two men in dazzling clothes began to speak to them; as the women relayed the words of promised resurrection to the other disciples, St. Luke writes that "but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them."

St. Luke tells the story of a bunch of Jesus' closest followers who are struggling to buy what he'd been selling to them all along. They didn't think that there could possibly be a happy ending to what had transpired the previous week; and yet, in the wonder and awesomeness of God, they were given the happy ending that had been promised to them. And from there, St. Luke concludes in his gospel, "they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God." (Luke 24:52-53 NRSV) We are invited to share this joyous news in our lives as well.

And there is indeed joy in doing so. We've all seen the surprised joy on the faces of those we love and care about when they've received a gift that they were so hopeful for; when they have been told that they are about to be grandparents for the first time; when they are informed that the cancer is in remission, and so many other moments that are captured and cherished in our memories. Being claimed in baptism and surrendering to the eternal promises of God is what gives these meaning. The resurrection of Jesus Christ on that first Easter morning, the complete and utter defeat of death, is what empowers us to hope, to dream, to live and to have purpose.

On this most glorious Resurrection Sunday which we will gather and celebrate this month, may you be filled with the full joy of the happy ending that has been written by our savior. And, just as importantly, may the world in which you live breathe, work, and love experience it as well, in the fullness and the joy of the happy ending that has no end.

For, He is risen....He is risen indeed! Alleluia!!

ANSWER: In the year 325 A.D., church officials decided Easter should be observed on the day Jesus rose from the dead – which was

on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the first day of spring. The first day of spring is always March 20 or March 21. But the first full moon after that date varies from year to year – and as a result Easter is celebrated as early as March 22 and as late as April 25.

10-21-1995 Thank you to Norris Mathison for making the new walnut processional cross.

12-27-1995 Dusk to dawn switch installed for south porch lights.

12-28-1995 Automatic door openers installed at the south entry.

1-15-1996 New sound system installed in Nave.

4-15-1996 Old well casing (in the ground south of the parsonage) removed and the hole sealed at the cost of \$627.

7-3-1996 Baseball diamonds remodeled, new fencing, grading, set up two diamonds; new fencing on tennis courts.
