From the Desk of Pastor Mark

Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶ A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." ¹⁷ He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." – St. John 21:15-17 (NRSV)

Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

After two years of building up to this moment, the NFL Draft and all the people who descended upon Green Bay and the Fox Cities over the past week are now on their way home or preparing to go, though they are leaving a lot of spent money behind. The nearly 300 college football players who were drafted over these three days will also be traveling in the coming weeks to their new homes, hoping to make an impact as they begin their professional gridiron careers. As for the fans of these teams, we are all now filled with renewed hope that this draft will finally get us over the hump and that in fewer than nine months the Lombardi Trophy will once again come back home to Green Bay.

An owner of a single (symbolic) stock share of the team can dream, can't he?

In the coming weeks the newly drafted players will be introduced to their new teams' playbooks and culture through orientations and minicamps. For some of the players, this will be a natural transition for which they've been preparing for some time now. For others, this will be an overwhelming experience which will make this transition much more difficult, and in the end, it may make the difference as to whether they will make the team.

For the disciples, the immediate aftermath of Jesus' resurrection was a time of great transition as well, easier for some, much more challenging for others. On the first Sunday after Easter, we annually hear the story of Doubting Thomas. For him, this was an obviously difficult transition to believe and embrace. But Thomas wasn't alone.

When Jesus appears again to the disciples following the resurrection he confronts Simon Peter in a way that challenges what he believes as well as how he enacts that trust. Three times Jesus asks Peter if he loves him. Three times Peter responds, though by the third time he is hurt because it seems that Jesus doesn't believe him.

But Peter couldn't be any further from the truth. The reality is that Jesus loves him so much and as he sees Peter's life in proclaiming God's love playing out, Jesus knows that it will not be easy for Peter, to the point that Peter himself will be executed in a brutish fashion.

This story is a powerful reminder that while the resurrection grants us hope beyond measure, those moments in this life that lead up to our baptismal promises being fulfilled are not always going to be filled with that same joy. We're all going to go through those moments when we wonder why God is testing us the way that He is; but, like Peter, it is not so much God testing us but rather loving us in a way that we simply can't believe or comprehend.

That's what the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus is all about – the unconditional and undefinable presence of God's love in our lives. Through it we learn that pain is covered by hope, that joy is covered by promise, and that our whole lives are covered by God's presence in them. May we always take comfort and hope in these assurances made possible by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

For, He is Risen....He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!!

GOD is in control of this sale, but He is using you to help make it a success.






11-15-1996 Four new highway church signs installed

1996 Our congregation adopted a new constitution

6-8-1997 The Colorado Blue Spruce planted at the west end of our outdoor worship area is in memory of granddaughter, Amy Elizabeth Peterson, from Earl and Betty Nelson

6-20-1997 Fire started in boiler room burning unit. Mostly smoke. Gas explosion in Winneconne happened at the same time.

5-22-1998 Highway signs redesigned and installed.

6-13-1998 Installed roof over part of the outdoor worship platform.

10-1-1998 Archives room finished.

10-6-1998 Installed new wooden cross in south stairwell.

10-17-1998 1903 corner stone opened. No box found.

10-21-1998 1952 corner stone opened. Found box. Contents examined on Sunday, 10-25-1998.

10-23-1998 Three new toilets installed in lower bathrooms by Olson Plumbing.

11-14-1998 Two corner stones reset by Jay Olson.
